I, Henry Baughan ____ of
Fayette County Ohio, do make and publish this my last will and testament
Item 1st.

I give and esire unto my beloved Wife, all my personal
Property, goods, monies and Effects during her natural life. At the death
Of my said wife, I give and devise unto each of my (following named) children
To witt Sarah Bush, Susanah Bush. (wife of Daniel Bush) Richard Baughan, Zackariah
Baughan, William H. Baughan, Benjamin F. Baughan, Amie Ann Yeoman. (wife of Enos
Yeoman) and Lucy Glaize (wife of Adam Glaize the sum of one hundred dollars each.

Item Second

I give an devise unto my Daughters, Sarah Bush, Susanah Bush,
Amie Ann Yeoman and Lucy Glaize all of my household and kitchen furniture and live
Stock. After the death of my wife to be divided equally among them.

Item third

After the Death of my said wife, I give and devise remainder of my
personal property, goods, monies, etc. (After the foregoing bequests are all paid according
to the provisions of Item 1st and 2 of this will) to my son Benjamin F. Baughan, Signed
and sealed, this 10th day of November A.D. 1853.
